



## Scheduling Options for Seniors

**See Mrs. Zeigler for more details and required paperwork for any program below.**

Senior Community Outreach- This program allows students to leave the building and earn up to two credits for an extended job shadowing experience or a job placement. The purpose is to explore career opportunities. Flexibility is a benefit to this program. It can be scheduled up to four periods of the day. Placement sites can vary each quarter. Students must attend daily even if they go to two different sites. Mentors must have clearances in order for students to earn credit. Paperwork for semester 1 is due by August 1. You will maintain a full schedule until paperwork is submitted.

Middle School Student Helper- This is under the Senior Community Outreach program, but guidelines differ. Students can be approved to help a teacher at the middle school for up to two periods a day. Paperwork for semester 1 is due by August 1. You will maintain a full schedule until paperwork is submitted.

Flexible Release- Flexible release can be scheduled for half the day. Students leave to go to their job. They do not earn any credit for this program and must provide proof of employment. You must be sure you have enough credits to graduate prior to scheduling this option.

**\*\*All three programs above are a privilege intended for students who are on track to graduate. Privileges can be revoked if students are not maintaining satisfactory academic progress or attendance.**

Certified Nurse Assistant Training- Working closely with HACC and West Perry, student schedules can sometimes be arranged so that students can attend CNA training through HACC. Students are responsible for paying for the course and for providing transportation to Carlisle high school, where training is held. Students may qualify for a scholarship to help offset costs when available. This program is held in the afternoons.

EMT Training- This year-long class is scheduled half-days at Susquenita High School. Students will receive training and can then register to take the state/ federal EMT certification exams. A fee is required.

Holy Spirit Career Exploration Program- Two students are selected by interview process to attend this program. Applications are available in the Counseling Center. The program lasts for the first marking period and meets daily from 7:30-9:30 at Holy Spirit. Students rotate through hospital departments to explore health careers.

ACE Mentoring Program- This is an evening program that meets at the Vo-Tech school in Mechanicsburg (or virtually) once a week for several months mid-year. It brings together a group of dedicated architects, engineers and contractors eager to help high school students better understand the rewarding opportunities available through careers in the building industry. There are often visits to building sites, offices, and other opportunities for hands-on experience.

Dual Enrollment Programs- HACC, Central Penn College, Shippensburg University, PA College of Health Sciences, and Messiah University offer dual enrollment programs. For a discounted rate, high school students can take college classes. This program is also flexible—attend for full day or half day. Please note dual enrollment student athletes must carry a total of 12 credits at the college each semester OR take a total of four classes between the college and West Perry.

Harrisburg University Enrichment programs- HU provides FREE, ONLINE training for students to become Medical Assistants, Pharmacy Technicians, or Informational Technology (computer) specialists. You can complete these programs on your own time or here at school.

Manufacturing Pre-Apprenticeship program- Students participate once a month in a free program to prepare them to enter a manufacturing apprenticeship after high school. The manufacturing field is not just factory work; high-tech, high-demand careers abound.
