



Scheduling Options for Seniors

Senior Community Outreach- This program allows students to leave the building and earn up to two credits for an extended job shadowing experience or a job placement. The purpose is to explore career opportunities. It can be scheduled up to four periods of the day. Placement sites can vary each quarter. Students must attend daily even if they go to two different sites. Mentors must have clearances in order for students to earn credit. Paperwork for semester 1 is due by August 1.

Middle School Student Helper- This is under the Senior Community Outreach program, but guidelines differ. Students can be approved to help a middle school teacher for up to two periods a day. Paperwork for semester 1 is due by August 1.

Flexible Release- Flexible release can be scheduled for half the day. Students leave to go to their job. They do NOT earn any credit for this program and must provide proof of employment. They must be sure to have enough credits to graduate prior to scheduling this option.

****All three programs above are a privilege intended for students who are on track to graduate. Privileges can be revoked if students are not maintaining satisfactory academic progress or attendance.**

Certified Nurse Assistant Training and EMT Training- Please let me know if you are interested in either of these programs. Opportunities often arise over the summer and I can share as available.

Citizen's Police Academy- This free, 8 week program allows students to learn about roles within the state police from canine handlers to criminal investigators/forensics to crash reconstruction specialists and more.

Holy Spirit Career Exploration Program- Two students are selected by interview process to attend this program. Applications are available in the Counseling Center and an interview with hospital staff is required. The program lasts for the first marking period and meets daily from 7:30-9:30 at Holy Spirit. Students rotate through hospital departments to explore health careers. See Mrs. Zeigler for more information.

Pennian Bank- Two students are selected by interview process to work in the West Perry branch of the bank. Stop in the bank office in the library and inquire if you are interested.

ACE Mentoring Program- This is an evening program that meets at the Vo-Tech in Mechanicsburg once a week for several months starting in January. It brings together a group of dedicated architects, engineers and contractors eager to help students better understand the rewarding opportunities available through careers in the building industry. Dual Enrollment Programs- HACC, Central Penn, Messiah, Harrisburg University, PA College of Health Science, and Shippensburg University offer dual enrollment programs. For a discounted rate, high school students can take college classes. This program is flexible—attend for full day or half day. Extensive information is available from Mrs. Zeigler about these options.

Harrisburg University Enrichment Programs- Students can take certification courses to become an IT Specialist, Medical Assistant, or Pharmacy Technician. These programs are online, often FREE, and also have hands-on lab kits for student simulations. Each program takes 6-9 months to complete and ends in an internship in a medical facility.

NuPaths- This is a developing opportunity for students interested in the computer field and will allow students to earn certain IT certifications prior to graduation. The cohort will meet at Greenwood High School throughout the year.

Pre-Manufacturing Apprenticeship Program- Manufacturing is a high demand industry. This program is a pipeline into an apprenticeship in manufacturing after graduation which can lead to a career in engineering, design, process, and manufacturing. This program includes OSHA certification, blueprint reading, shop projects and more. See Mrs. Zeigler if you are interested.
